The meeting was brought to order by Chairman Comerford for the purpose of discussing OA Maintenance Consolidation.

Larry Kay briefed the Commissioners on a meeting he and staff had with Jeff Schaeperkoetter, Director of Facilities Management, Design & Construction on June 21st regarding a statewide consolidation of all maintenance positions, and associated funding, in the next 60 to 90 days. Mr. Schaeperkoetter requested that, if the Commission disagrees, to provide him with a written rebuttal no later than July 1st. He stated that he is not the decision maker but that Doug Nelson with the Governor's Office will make the decision.

After much discussion regarding the Commission's Type III Agency, Regulatory Authority requirements, life safety issues, construction and financial impact. Chairman Comerford instructed Larry Kay to draft a white paper and deliver to Jeff Schaeperkoetter this Friday outlining the Commission's position. Also he instructed Jill Talken to deliver a letter to John Watson, Governor's Chief of Staff from him stating the Missouri Veterans Commission is unanimously against being a part of statewide maintenance consolidation in both our Cemeteries and Homes Programs.

With no further business before the Commission the meeting was adjourned.
