The meeting was called to order by Chairman Comerford at 12:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing MVC 2013 Capitol Improvement Appropriation.

Director Kay discussed the following:

- Current situation (\$1 entry fee scenario versus HB 1731)
 - 1. Missouri Veterans Needs Study (current and future)
 - 2. \$5.5 M Capital Improvement Appropriation request for initial proposal for new Veterans Home

Members of the Commission recommended the use of internal staff and volunteers to update the 2006 Rose Study, determine what actually needs to be outsourced by the Commission and get costs. An update will be provided at the May 2012 Quarterly Commission Meeting.

The Commission discussed the Governor's recommended \$5.5 M Capital Improvement Appropriation for the purpose of construction of a new Veterans Home. The Commissioners expressed the view that the Commission is not prepared to construct a new Veterans Home this year. It was decided that Larry Kay and Julie Miller would continue to work closely with the Office of Administration Budget and Planning. They will model revenue scenarios in light of the Governor's request and keep the Commission apprised of the possibilities.

With no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
